SWECO and Vattenfall have agreed to terminate their collaboration in the jointly-owned company SwedPower International.

SWECO's subsidiary company SWECO Energuide AB and Vattenfall AB have for many years conducted consulting operations in electrical power technology outside Sweden through SwedPower International AB. The companies have now agreed to develop operations separately, under their own auspices.

This means that SWECO is withdrawing from SwedPower International in order in the future to run operations abroad in the area of electrical power under its own name. Vattenfall will continue to run its consulting operations abroad through SwedPower International, which becomes a wholly-owned subsidiary in the Vattenfall Group.

SWECO Energuide will conclude its current assignments in SwedPower International's name.
