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The loss after financial items was SEK –27.0 million (–35.6).

Earnings per share after full income tax totaled SEK -2.09 (-2.57).

The cash flow after investments was SEK -22.9 million (58.4).

Third guarter operating earnings amounted to SEK –0.4 million (1.4).

Gradual improvement during the year

Market trends

While demand was stable in the third quarter of 2003, economic trends remained instable. After declining in the first quarter, demand was flat in the second and third quarters. The opinion is that the production volumes of customers are no longer decreasing.

The generally main source of uncertainty from now on will be the weak U.S. dollar and the decline in Swedish production volumes that may ensue.

Following a slow first quarter, the telecom infrastructure business unit faced somewhat improved prospects. Demand remained at a low, but relatively uniform, level during both the second and third quarter. Somewhat increased activity was noted in the segment. However, telecom infrastructure was still subject to significant price pressure.

In a generally cautious market, the IT/Mechatronics business unit was characterized by large differences among various areas and businesses. Some areas exhibited an altered and somewhat more forward-looking climate. The trend appeared to stem from the fact that companies were no longer cutting back on their production volumes.

Following an across-the-board decline, the market for the medical equipment business unit was cautious. In addition, a number of PartnerTech's customers were affected by the limited access to venture capital.

Net sales, earnings and profitability

Net sales were SEK 960.2 million (988.5) for the first nine months of 2003. That represents a decrease of 3% from the same period of 2002. Net sales rose by 3% to SEK 307.6 million (299.7) from the third quarter of 2002 to the third quarter of 2003.

Net sales for comparable units declined by SEK 124.3 million, or 13%, from the first nine months of 2002 to the first nine months of 2003.

The decrease from the third quarter of 2002 to the third quarter of 2003 was SEK 20.1 million, or 7%.

Operating earnings for the first nine months of 2003 were SEK –19.5 million (–27.4), up SEK 7.9 million from the same period of 2002. The loss, most of which was attributable to the first quarter, was chiefly due to organic volume reductions early in the year.

Third quarter operating earnings were SEK –0.4 million (1.4). That represents an ongoing improvement from the first two quarters. The increase was due to the fact that volumes were no longer being reduced, along with impact of the action programs that the group had carried out or that are currently under way.

Net interest income for the first nine months of 2003 was SEK –7.6 million (–8.2).

The loss after financial items for the same period was SEK –27.0 million (–35.6).

Financial position and liquidity

Excluding PartnerTech's acquisition of the mechanics unit in Karlskoga, operating capital declined by SEK 103.8 million. Including the acquisition, the decrease from the same period of 2002 was SEK 91.4 million. Operating capital improved late in the second quarter and during the third quarter as a result of work having begun on previous orders and the third quarter's normal seasonal increase.

Operating capital at the end of September totaled SEK 485.3 million (576.7), SEK 12.4 million of which stemmed from the acquisition of the Karlskoga mechanics unit.

Working capital amounted to SEK 264.9 million (277.4) on September 30. That represents an increase of SEK 18.4 million since the beginning of the year.



Net investment for the period was SEK 30.4 million (4.3), SEK 3.3 million (1.7) of which was attributable to the third quarter. The acquisition of the mechanics unit in Karlskoga contributed SEK 20.7 million to the figure.

Cash flow after investments was SEK –22.9 million (58.4) for the first nine months. Excluding the acquisition, cash flow after investments amounted to SEK –10.5 million.

The negative cash flow after investments of SEK –7.2 million (–3.0) in the third quarter resulted primarily from an increase in new orders and the seasonal accumulation of working capital.

Net borrowing, i.e. interest-bearing liabilities less cash and equivalents, was SEK 192.8 million (196.1) at the end of September. That constitutes an increase of SEK 28.6 million since the beginning of the year.

Shareholders' equity came to SEK 292.5 million (380.6) on September 30.

The equity/assets ratio was 36.2% (41.9) at the end of the period.

Personnel.

The number of full-time employees averaged 1,135 (1,091) for the first nine months. The acquisition of the mechanics unit in Karlskoga increased the figure by 127.

The group had 1,152 (1,102) full-time employees at the end of the period.

Accounting principles

The same accounting policies have been applied as in the most recent annual report, with the exception of Swedish Financial Accounting Standards Council Recommendation 22, for which the portion of overdraft facilities previously posted to long-term liabilities is now included under short-term liabilities.

Important developments during the period

PartnerTech took over the Saab Bofors Dynamics machining center in Karlskoga on January 1. With some 125 employees, the acquired unit generated annual sales of approximately SEK 150 million. The takeover coincided with the consolidation of PartnerTech's Karlskoga and Storfors units at the one Karlskoga location. As a result, PartnerTech's mechanics center in Karlskoga now employs more than 200 people and is one of Sweden's largest, most advanced operations in its field.

A number of key contracts and collaboration agreements strengthened PartnerTech's market position during the period. In February, Axis Communications chose PartnerTech as its exclusive contract manufacturer in Sweden. The collaborative arrangement will add approximately SEK 40 million to PartnerTech's annual sales.

Telecom supplier LGP/Allgon Microwave decided in June to outsource the manufacture of electronic components for six of its radio link system products to



PartnerTech. The assignment is expected to bolster PartnerTech's annual sales by approximately SEK 40 million.

In September Hypercom Financial AB decided to work with PartnerTech on its biggest global product development project yet. The assignment involves a terminal for secure electronic payment. The Hypercom group will market the product worldwide. The deal, which covers both development and production, will increase PartnerTech's annual sales by an estimated SEK 80-100 million.

In October, PartnerTech signed an agreement with EssNet, a manufacturer of gaming systems. The agreement involves the production and distribution of PC-based gaming terminals. Three orders with an approximate total value of SEK 65 million make up the agreement. Initial delivery will begin in 2003.

Upcoming financial reports

The Preliminary Earnings Report for full-year 2003 will be released on February 11, 2004.

The January-March 2004 interim report will be released on April 22, the January-June interim report on July 15 and the January-September interim report on October 21.

The Annual General Meeting will be held on April 22, 2004.
