## Saab wins MSEK 150 order for fire control system

**Saab Systems has won an order from Alvis Hägglunds/Patria for the UTAAS fire control system. The order is worth MSEK 150 and is a continuation of a previous order of UTAAS for the Finnish Army's CV9030 Combat Vehicles.**
