EVERYDAY.COM PORTAL LAUNCHED IN SPAIN

The Internet portal, Everyday.com, is being launched today in Spain. The portal, which was started in Sweden just over a year ago, now operates in thirteen countries and has more than 1.4 million registered members. The launch continues Everyday's strategy of establishing sites in all countries where the pan-European telecommunications company, Tele2, provides its services. Tele2 plans to offer fixed telephony in Spain in the near future. Everyday complements Tele2 by offering subscription-free Internet, free e-mail, and a wide range of content and e-shopping services.

Everyday.com is a joint venture between NetCom AB and Modern Times Group MTG AB and aims to establish, operate and continuously develop a broad-based commercial Internet portal. Everyday.com's brand and underlying technology are used to offer free Internet access and services to Tele2 and third-party subscribers. Tele2 offers the service by renting infrastructure from existing local Internet service providers (ISPs) and, therefore, avoids incurring fixed costs in areas where Tele2 is not an ISP.

Everyday.com is already present in local language versions in the following countries: Sweden, Norway, Denmark, Finland, Estonia, the Netherlands, France, Austria, Italy, Switzerland, Germany and Luxembourg.
