## Vattenfall joins procurement exchange portal

Vattenfall and ten leading utilities from across Europe today signed a shareholders' agreement to form an independent industry procurement exchange named Eutilia.

Internet-based trading will start this spring and will focus on catalogue purchasing, forward and reverse auctions and procurement management information. Eutilia's headquarters will be based in Leiden in the Netherlands.

Eutilia will be a neutral marketplace and will provide value added services for both suppliers to and buyers in the utility industry by giving them greater market reach and reducing transaction costs. Its initial focus will be on the European electricity and water industries. Eutilia will provide an exchange that will improve the efficiency of procurement, supply chain management and capacity utilisation.

The estimated collective annual procurement spending (including capital expenditure but excluding labour and fuel) of the founder utilities exceeds 30 billion Euro.

The founders of Eutilia are Vattenfall (Sweden), Scottish Power (UK), Endesa (Spain), EDF (France), RWE (Germany), Enel (Italy), Iberdrola (Spain), Electrabel (Belgium), United Utilities (UK), National Grid Company (UK) and Nuon (Netherlands).
