The famous Pyramid at Stockport will be from today (9 July, 2002) run on power

generated from sewage.

The 120 ft high glass landmark, home of Internet bank **smile**, is now run on electricity

produced from methane, a by-product of digested sewage.

The green power comes from a plant in Bournemouth where the sewage is digested

and the gas is used to produce electricity, which is delivered by Scottish and Southern

Energy plc.

The new source of power replaces the previous renewable energy generated by using

gasses emitted from a landfill site, and is considerably greener.

Bob Head, Chief Executive of smile said:" As part of The Co-operative Bank, smile is

very proud of our record on renewable energy and it is great that we can now say that

smile is run on poo. I would like to thank the people of Bournemouth for their efforts."

98 per cent of the electricity used by The Co-operative Bank comes from renewable

energy. For example its head office in the centre of Manchester uses power generated

by a turbine on the Manchester Ship Canal.
