

Icelandair väljer SAS Ground Services på Charles de Gaulle Airport

Icelandair har slutit avtal med SAS Ground Services om passagerarservice på Charles de Gaulle Airport i Paris. Avtalet trädde i kraft den 1 februari.

Det nya avtalet tillsammans med SGS' nuvarande avtal med Icelandair i de nordiska länderna innebär ca 2 450 flygavgångar per år.

Icelandair opererar med fyra flygningar per vecka till Reykjavik och ökar till nio per vecka under sommarsäsongen.
