The acquisition of the bed producer Timbo will strengthen Hilding Anders' position in the French market.

Hilding Anders has acquired all shares in the bed producer Timbo, located in Lusigny Sur Barse, east of Paris. The company's net sales 2006 amounted to SEK 160 million. The acquisition of Timbo strengthens Hilding Anders' position in France.

Timbo was founded in 1983 and has grown to become one of the main bed producers in France. The company is operating within all segments for bed frames and will support Hilding Anders' French bedding companies André Renault and Wifor with their bed base collections.

"As France is one of Hilding Anders' core markets it is important for us to secure and strengthen our market position there, says Anders Pålsson, President and CEO of Hilding Anders. With Timbo in our Group we will be able to develop strong concepts and exclusive models for customers in the European market."

Timbo is the forth acquisition made by Hilding Anders during 2007, and is a part of an extensive expansion strategy.
